OPPORTUNITY


- Revitalize Gateway Park to be the true gateway that Mountain View's community wants, needs, and deserves.
- * A magnetic destination that people want to visit, engage, and remember in pictures.

BRIEF HISTORY

- * 1849 the original Mountain View town center was a stage coach stop with shops and a hotel near El Camino and Grant Road.
- * 1920 to 1964 the community creates a *Mountain View sign* to lure travelers from El Camino to the *new downtown* on Castro Street... *It worked!*
- * El Camino/Castro Intersection, historically and currently, has expanded setbacks by urban design to make it a *center*.
- * Today, Gateway Park is regularly coveted by developers, and its "Gatewayness" is lost and neglected. It needs to be revitalized, ahead of the developments planned in the surrounding area, which will try to absorb or influence the signature effect and benefits of Gateway Park.










REVITALIZE

- Neighboring cities such as Sunnyvale and Redwood City have modern gateways of note.
- * A new well-designed sign that reflects our historic past and bright future, such as:
 - * MOUNTAIN VIEW a small town with a big heart
- * A redesign of the center of the park to have an invitingly attractive artwork feature.
- * A level grade to make the space inviting.

- * Survey the existing site, if one does not exist.
- Create a creative brief of what the new site is to be that city council & community supports.
- * Appoint a Gateway Park Revitalization Director to ensure the project moves forward and stays on course to deliver the best possible achievement in world-class design, aesthetic, and execution, within a reasonable budget.
